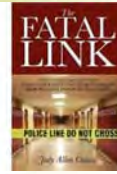

Jody Allen Crowe has spent 18 years as a teacher, principal and superintendent where he learned firsthand the devastation of prenatal exposure to alcohol. He developed award-winning school programs designed around the research of brain damage from prenatal exposure to alcohol. He is the founder of Healthy Brains for Children, a non-profit organization focused on lowering the incidence of prenatal exposure to alcohol. He is also the author of the Fatal Link: The Connection Between School Shooters and the Brain Damage from Prenatal Exposure to Alcohol.



Sara Messelt is the Executive Director at the MN Organization on Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, a statewide resource on FASD. Her ongoing commitment to children, youth, and families is evident in her 30 years of work in the non-profit/health and human service field. Under her leadership, MOFAS continues to expand its prevention and family engagement initiatives, advocate for the rights of individuals with FASD, provide education and training, and to ensure all women know that there is no safe level of alcohol use while pregnant.
